Concordat between the Police and Crime Commissioner for Surrey and the Chief Constable of Surrey Police

General principles:

- We will at all times work towards the best interests of protecting the people of Surrey
- We will uphold the Policing Protocol Order 2011 and at all times have regard to our respective roles detailed within the protocol
- We will uphold the Nolan principles in working together and carrying out our respective functions: *Selflessness; Openness; Honesty; Leadership; Integrity; Objectivity; Accountability*
- We will foster a relationship which is mutually respectful and where the PCC holds the Chief Constable to account in a constructive and supportive way
- We will exchange information in an open and accountable way
- We will develop a scheme of governance, which clearly sets out our respective oversight mechanisms, financial controls and working arrangements
- We will work to resolve any difficulties in a constructive and open manner, seeking advice and mediation from our respective national bodies where difficulties cannot be resolved locally
- We will ensure that staff in both of our organisations work together well, with mutual respect for their respective roles
- As set out by the Committee for Standards in Public Life, the Police and Crime Plan will include a commitment for the PCC to hold the Chief Constable to account for promoting ethical behaviour and embedding the College of Policing's Code of Ethics
- We will abide by the Code of Ethics and Conduct set out by our respective professional bodies – the Code of Conduct set by the Association of Police and Crime Commissioners and the Code of Ethics set by the College of Policing
- The PCC will be transparent in the appointment of the Chief Constable and senior staff to the PCC's office
- The PCC will publish details of pay, rewards, gifts and hospitality, business interests and notifiable memberships
