Executive Summary:

For 2017/18 the Police and Crime Commissioner has made available £500,000 of funding to ensure continued support to local community, voluntary and faith organisations.

Applications for Core Service Awards under £5000

Freedom Leisure – The Friday Night Project

To award £2,000 to Freedom Leisure to support the running of the Friday Night Project in Woking. The project is a multi activity evening at the local leisure centre. It aims to provide personal development, social development and a healthy, active lifestyles through sport.

Change of Scene – Early Intervention

To award Change of Scene £2,500 to support young people from areas of disadvantage meet their potential by working with them to tackle their social, emotional and behavioural difficulties.

Woking Borough Council – Junior Citizen

To award £2,500 to Woking Borough Council towards the running of the Junior Citizen event in Woking. The event support Year 6 students understand their personal and community safety.

Child Safety Media – Junior Citizen

To award £2,500 to Child Safety Media towards the running of the Junior Citizen event in Reigate and Banstead. The event helps Year 6 students of transition to secondary schools by teaching the young people about their personal safety.


The Commissioner supports the core service applications and small grants applications to the Community Safety Fund and awards to the following;
