Executive Summary:

For 2018/19 the Police and Crime Commissioner has made available £500,000 of funding to ensure continued support to local community, voluntary and faith organisations.

Applications for Core Service Awards under £5000

Child Safety Media – Junior Citizen

To award £2,500 to Child Safety Media towards the running of the Junior Citizen event in Reigate and Basteard. The event helps Year 6 students of transition to secondary schools by teaching the young people about their personal safety.

Woking Borough Council – Junior Citizen

To award the Woking Borough Council £2,500 toward the running of the Junior Citizen event in Woking. This is an annual event where year 6 pupils from all the local primary schools in Woking are invited to take part in a half day session on personal safety. About 1000 young people aged 10 and 11 attend each year to learn some important lessons through fun, interactive sessions at Woking Football Club. The topics include stranger danger, fire safety, being a good neighbour, water safety, healthy eating and railway safety.

Recommendation


The Commissioner supports the core service applications and small grants applications to the Community Safety Fund and awards to the following;
