1.0 Executive Summary

In October 2014, the Police and Crime Commissioner (PCC) took on responsibility for commissioning support services for victims of crime to help them cope and recover.

For the financial year 2018/19 the PCC was allocated £1,370,103 by the Ministry of Justice for the commissioning and/or provision of emotional and practical support services for victims' of crime.

This paper outlines the utilisation of a proportion of this funding.

Grant: £26,804


Summary: To enable the Rape and Sexual Abuse Support Centre (RASASC) to continue the provision continuation of the Leatherhead based 'Hub' which enables clients from the East of the county to access face-to-face counselling.

The Hub is especially important for those who find traveling to Guildford, problematic. The counselling provides support to help survivors cope and recover from the impact of rape and/or sexual abuse.
