Executive Summary:

At the start of the Covid-19 pandemic in the UK and national lockdown the Police and Crime Commissioner has made available £500,000 from the operational reserve available to ensure essential services continued support to local vulnerable residents in Surrey, including those at greater risk due to isolation measures. The emergency funding was made available to those organisations who have already received funding from the PCC in previous years.

Applications for Covid-19 emergency funding

Surrey Drug and Alcohol Care Ltd – Radio Advertising

To award Surrey Drug and Alcohol Care £5,600 to run a radio campaign to make people aware of 24hour Freephone helpline which is available to those feeling isolated and fearful at this time. The helpline supports those struggling with mental issues, drug and alcohol addiction and refers them onto counselling and support.

Crimestoppers - Communication

To award Crimestoppers £6,300 in funding to support the national campaigns focusing on those areas it is expected we will see a rise in crime. Crimestoppers want to support services in making the public aware of their reporting lines should they not want to report to the police and wish to stay anonymous.

Recommendation

The Commissioner supports the core service applications and small grants applications to the Community Safety Fund and awards to the following;

- £5,600 to Surrey Drug and Alcohol Care Ltd for a radio campaign
- £6,300 to Crimestoppers for their communication campaign
