### Funding for the provision of victim services

## 1.0 Summary

In October 2014, Police and Crime Commissioners (PCCs) took on responsibility for commissioning support services for victims of crime, to help individuals cope and recover from their experiences. This paper sets out recent funding committed by the PCC in fulfilment of these duties.

## 2.0 Standard Funding Agreements

- 2.1 Service:** Core Rape & Sexual Assault Service 2021/22
- Provider:** RASASC
- Grant:** £157,912
- Summary:** Provision of Helpline and Independent Sexual Violence Advisors (ISVAs).
- Budget:** Victim's Fund 2021/22
- 
- 2.2 Service:** Stalking Advocates and Training
- Provider:** East Surrey Domestic Abuse Service (ESDAS) and Surrey Police
- Grant:** £70,895
- Summary:** Stalking advocacy and support provision to be embedded within existing community support services and Surrey Police's internal Victim and Witness Care Unit. The service will also provide cross-agency training to public-facing staff, ensuring the best possible support for stalking victims.
- Budget:** Precept Uplift 2021/22.

### 3.0 Ministry of Justice Uplift Funding Allocation

3.1 For 2021/22, the Ministry of Justice has made additional funding available to PCCs, intended to support local domestic abuse and sexual assault services. Surrey has received £226,352 under this allocation.

3.1 Based on engagement with local partners, providers and an open bidding process, the PCC has agreed the following allocations:
