Executive Summary:

 The Police and Crime Commissioner (PCC) is required to sign-off the proposed revenue and capital budgets for Surrey Police. A proposed budget was put forward to the PCC and discussed at the webcast March Monthly Management Meeting. The PCC agreed to the proposed budget at that meeting. This paper formalises that agreement.

Background

- The attached paper details the budget proposals for Surrey Police for 2013-14. The total gross revenue budget is proposed at £207.7m. This is funded through government funding of £111m and council tax of £97m.
- Savings to be made total £5.1m through collaboration, estates changes and other non-staff savings.
- Growth items include inflation, a social media fund for better engagement and intelligence gathering and technology infrastructure.
- The proposed capital budget for new schemes totals £4.5m. This includes capital for fleet renewal and ICT renewal and investment. The capital to be carried forward from 2012-13 to 2013-14 will be presented a future meeting for approval.
