Executive Summary

Sections 22 and 23 of the Police Act 1996 provide for joint working between police forces and/or Police & Crime Commissioners where, in the opinion of the Chief Constable or Commissioner, collaboration would deliver greater efficiency or effectiveness. The Commissioner has agreed to sign a collaboration agreement under Section 22A of the Police Act 1996 which relates to collaboration between Surrey and Sussex Police forces.

Background

Surrey and Sussex PCCs and Chief Constables have agreed to establish collaboration arrangements under a lead force model. As required in legislation a Section 22A agreement has been written to ensure that the responsibilities of the Chief Constables and PCCs are clear and unambiguous.

The intent of the collaboration is to establish and operate Joint Services where, in the interests of efficiency and/ or effectiveness of either or both forces, those Joint Services are judged to be best delivered under a Lead Force Model. The agreement sets out the arrangements for delivering those Joint Services including governance and financial arrangements.

The Section 22A Agreement has been approved by the Chief Constable for signature and by the PCC and Chief Constable of Sussex Police. Details of the agreement will not be published given its operational nature.
