Executive Summary:

For 2016/17 the Police and Crime Commissioner has made available £690,920 of funding to ensure continued support to local community, voluntary and faith organisations.

The Community Safety Fund, following some large applications is now closed for 2016/17 with the funding hub reopening for applications for 2017/18 on the 1st March 2017. However, there are two final applications detailed below that require funding this financial year.

Applications for Core Service Awards over £5000

Guildford Borough Council - Joint Enforcement Teams

To award Guildford Borough Council £50,000 to development and support the establishment of a Joint Enforcement Team in Guildford. The JET approach would see more uniforms on the street (meaning extra eyes and ears throughout the borough) and more liveried vehicles providing a visible response to ASB and increasing the Community's awareness that their concerns and priorities are being heard and that appropriate action was being taken by the Council, the Police and other agencies in partnership. Similar to other JETs in Surrey the partners would be bought together for targeted joint operations, providing a quicker, more robust response and longer term solution to ASB issues affecting the Community. The JET would support the work of the Safer Guildford Community Safety Partnership and its sub groups. Particularly the Joint Action Group, that works to identify and tackle antisocial behaviour hotspot locations and perpetrators. The £50,000 pump prime award will see Guildford Borough Council purchase uniforms, training, vehicles and other supporting equipment to run a successful JET.

Applications for Small Grant Awards up to £5000 - Community Safety Fund

Surrey Police – ASB Survey

To award £89.63 to Surrey Police for the addition of an additional question in the Anti-Social Behaviour Victims Satisfaction Survey. The survey is monthly to ascertain the views of victims on the service they received from Surrey Police. The additional questions seeks to understand more about the type of support service they would expect or require.

Recommendation

The Commissioner supports the core service applications and small grants applications to the Community Safety Fund and awards to the following;

- £50,000 to Guildford Borough Council to establish a Joint Enforcement Team in the borough of Guildford
- £89.36 to Surrey Police for an additional question in the ASB Victims Survey
