Executive Summary:

For 2017/18 the Police and Crime Commissioner has made available £750,000 of funding to ensure continued support to local community, voluntary and faith organisations. An amount of £250,000 has been ring-fenced for projects that will reduce reoffending in Surrey.

In June 2017 the Community Safety Fund (reducing reoffending), received 1 application for funding for a small grant.

Applications for small grants £5000 and under

Browns Community Services CIC have requested funding of £5000 to deliver four of their six session bespoke 4Es to Employment courses. Aim primarily at ex-offenders, the courses will be delivered to small groups with a maximum number of 12 on each course – this will allow for tailored attention and advice from the 4Es trainer. Browns will deliver the courses within a confidential and safe environment that allows service users to discuss and explore the skills needed to successfully gain employment.

All of the courses will be delivered in Runnymede and the borough council has match funded £5000 for delivery of these courses in their locality.

Recommendation

The Commissioner supports application to the Community Safety Fund for a small grant and awards to the following;

• £5000 to Browns Community services CIC to deliver four 4Es to employment courses in Runnymede.
