Reducing Reoffending Fund Application – December 2019

Executive Summary:

For 2019/20 the Police and Crime Commissioner has made available £255,000 of funding to reduce reoffending in Surrey. With external grants awarded to the value of £86,132, £25,000 from the CSF towards HICD and funding awarded for other services to date, this means the total amount available in November 2019 is £44,314 (with £29,993 committed to Transform Housing before April 2020).

In December 2019 the fund received the following applications;

Applications for Small Grants under £5000

Leatherhead Start – Housing & support for offenders - £5000

The project provides short-term housing and support for clients with offending history including those engaged with the Probation Service and the Surrey Police Integrated Offended Management Team


The Commissioner supports the standard grant application to the Reducing Reoffending Fund and awards to the following;
