**Executive Summary:** The PCC has made available an additional £500,000 to support existing providers with their additional costs caused as a direct result of the Covid-19 pandemic

### Background

The following organisation has applied for assistance from the Coronavirus Support Fund;

#### Surrey Police – Op Swordfish

To award £19,396.80 Surrey Police to support Operation Swordfish which is a Policing Operation to reduce casualties on the road by carrying out Engagement, Education and Enforcement. This is in response to a number of recent concerns raised by the Community and noted by Police during recent road safety checks, especially in relation to anti-social motorcyclists the Dorking Area. Historically there have been a disproportionate number of people killed and seriously injured on motorcycles in this area attributed to poor riding and driving which has allowed an average speed check to be installed on the section from Givons Grove to the Burford Bridge. It is anticipated this plan is flexible and can be applied with local knowledge to other identified problem areas in the district, including the Capel By-pass and adjoin areas where similar problems exist. The funding approved will go towards officer overtime.


#### Recommendation:
