Key dates

- The competition will run for three weeks from Friday 11th March, to the end of Thursday, 31 March 2021. Entrants must be between 15-25yrs old and live in Surrey to take part.
- The placement will take place during the Easter school holidays, on at least four days between 06-15 April to be agreed with the competition winner. Entrants will need to be able to travel to the Guildford area and will be provided with expense money for their travel and lunches.

Our commitment to children and young people in Surrey

Enhancing the support and opportunities available to young people in Surrey is a key priority of Surrey's Police and Crime Commissioner Lisa Townsend. This focus of our office is being led by the Deputy Commissioner Ellie Vesey-Thompson with partners including Surrey Police.

Our office has recently provided fresh funding to enhance support for children affected by criminal exploitation in Surrey and extended our funding further for organisations that provide specialist mental health and practical support for children and young people affected by sexual violence. We're also looking at new ways to enhance opportunities for young people to avoid crime and make the right choices through education and diversionary activities.

About the Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner

The Police and Crime Commissioner is elected by Surrey residents to oversee the performance of Surrey Police and help improve the service that our communities receive. The Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner supports the Commissioner's work with partners across Surrey to promote community safety, help prevent and reduce crime and enhance support for vulnerable people.

Your Commissioner in Surrey is Lisa Townsend. Lisa is responsible for:

- Setting the Police and Crime Plan for Surrey Police. The Plan outlines the
 areas that the Surrey Police should focus on and is informed by regular
 engagement between the Commissioner and Surrey residents. The priorities
 for 2021-25 include preventing violence against women and girls, protecting
 people from harm and making roads in Surrey safer.
- Monitoring and reporting back on how well Surrey Police are doing. The
 Commissioner does this by holding regular meetings with the Chief Constable
 and sharing public reports on topics such as how quickly Surrey Police
 respond to incidents, and what is being done about specific types of crime or
 concerns from Surrey residents. The Commissioner's Office then works
 closely with Surrey Police to improve the service provided.
- Funding key services that work alongside the police to reduce crime, support vulnerable people and victims, and make Surrey safer. This is one of the areas where your Commissioner makes a really big impact. For example, services for vulnerable people that faced challenges during the height of the pandemic were able to reach more people thanks to funding from our office. The Commissioner is also responsible for Surrey Police finances and advocates on national policing issues.
